Silver allows you to explore and experience a diverse range of literature, some of which can be easily accessed online.

**Poetry** – read between fifteen to twenty poems in total using the sources below. Write a list of all the poets and poems that you have read and listened too. This must be stuck into your scheme next to the activity as your evidence of what you have read as there is no AR book quiz for poetry.


These are only a few suggestions and not a complete list.

I know this isn't ideal but have a go, if you find them a little too challenging don't worry, you can come back to this part of your Silver later on. Five Children and It, The Phoenix and The Carpet, Wonderful Wizard of Oz, Alice's Adventures in Wonderland, The Wind in the Willows are also Fantasy, so could be used for either Pre 1914 or Fantasy but don't use the same book for both.

**Information Book** - Accelerated Reader have given free limited access to schools to their online reading platform myON. Please be aware that this is an American based resource, additionally much of the fiction is at a lower AR than we generally expect many of you to read by this stage. There are lots of information books; you will have plenty of choice as these are easy to find at every level right up to AR 9. However, not all of the books have AR book quizzes attached but you can check this yourselves, just read through this guide.

Select **A ATOS**, this will give you the books by AR level




Now select your book level **number**, remembering that there are few fiction books at AR 5+ but plenty of information books at higher levels.


Once you have chosen your AR level click on the **magnifying glass** to search through that level



You can now scroll through all the available books at that level to see what you might want to read



Moving your mouse over the books gives you the options **read** or **info**. Select **info** 



You now have an **overview** of the book and can decide if you would want to read it




If it sounds interesting select the **i** which will give the book details. Please check:
