This leaflet provides prospective sixth form students with an idea of the courses available in the sixth form at Spalding High School from September 2018.

We are an academic grammar school offering A Level courses (or equivalents) in a wide variety of subjects.

Entry requirements

Main entry requirements

Students must achieve at least a Grade 4 in GCSE English Language or English Literature **and** Mathematics in addition to 4 further GCSEs at grades at 9-4 or A* - C .

Students must also achieve at least a Grade 6/Grade B in the subjects they wish to study at A Level (in the case of new subjects a Grade 5 in English Language or Literature will be required.)

Additional entry requirements
