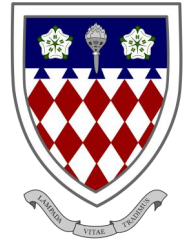


# Spalding High School

Welcome back to the start of the new academic year 2024-25. I hope that everyone had an amazing summer break filled with relaxation and fun! At my end of year assembly in July, I reminisced about my childhood recollections of the summer holidays and how they felt almost endless. Sadly, as an adult, they seem to pass all too quickly!

The first few weeks will have dragged for our Year 11 and Year 13 students waiting for their examination results but oh my goodness – how well they did!

We are **so** proud of our Year 13 and Year 11 students who have worked tremendously hard over the last two years and achieved some amazing examination results.

At A Level, many subjects achieved at least half of their grades at A\*-B, the highest grades possible. More than three hundred qualifications were taken by the Sixth Form this summer, with more than three quarters being at A\*-C grades and our students' results are testament to their commitment and hard work alongside the support of their parents and carers and the dedication of our experienced staff. We are also incredibly proud of our first cohort of students who have taken the AQA Extended Project Qualification. The EPQ is an A-level standard standalone qualification designed to extend and develop students' abilities beyond A-level syllabus and prepare for university or future careers. More than two thirds of our EPQ students achieved grade A\*, A or B.

Over 1500 qualifications were taken by our Year 11 students this summer and, of those, 46% were graded at Grades 7–9; the very highest grades possible, which is an increase on last year. The High School results compare very favourably with the national Grade 7-9 attainment rate of 21.7% and regional rate of 18.3% Grade 7-9.

Well done to you all!

As the event time grew nearer, I realised that it would be beneficial to start training for it, so I joined the local Park Run group and participated in 5k park runs to build up stamina.

On Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> of July 2024, I made my way to the Lincolnshire Showground, the venue for my Race for Life. I was apprehensive but also pleased to be part of something bigger. After applying my race number, I completed the back panel showing for whom I was racing. I was due to start with the second tranche of runners and after doing some warmup exercises, we started dead on time.

It was an interesting course with lots of obstacle challenges, including mud slides, muddy tubes, crawl nets, balancing challenges, cargo nets and mud chutes. By the time the finishing line was in sight, I was tired and very muddy but really pleased I had finished the course in just 35 minutes. Then it was time to collect my finishers' medal, have a drink, something to eat, then home for a shower and a rest.

Now for the important bit. Thanks to the generosity of all those who sponsored me ranging from SHS teachers, school friends, army cadets, my rugby club, family and friends, I raised a grand total of £532 (including gift aid) which has gone to Cancer Research, for them to work their magic. It was a wonderful experience which I would happily do again. So here's to next year!

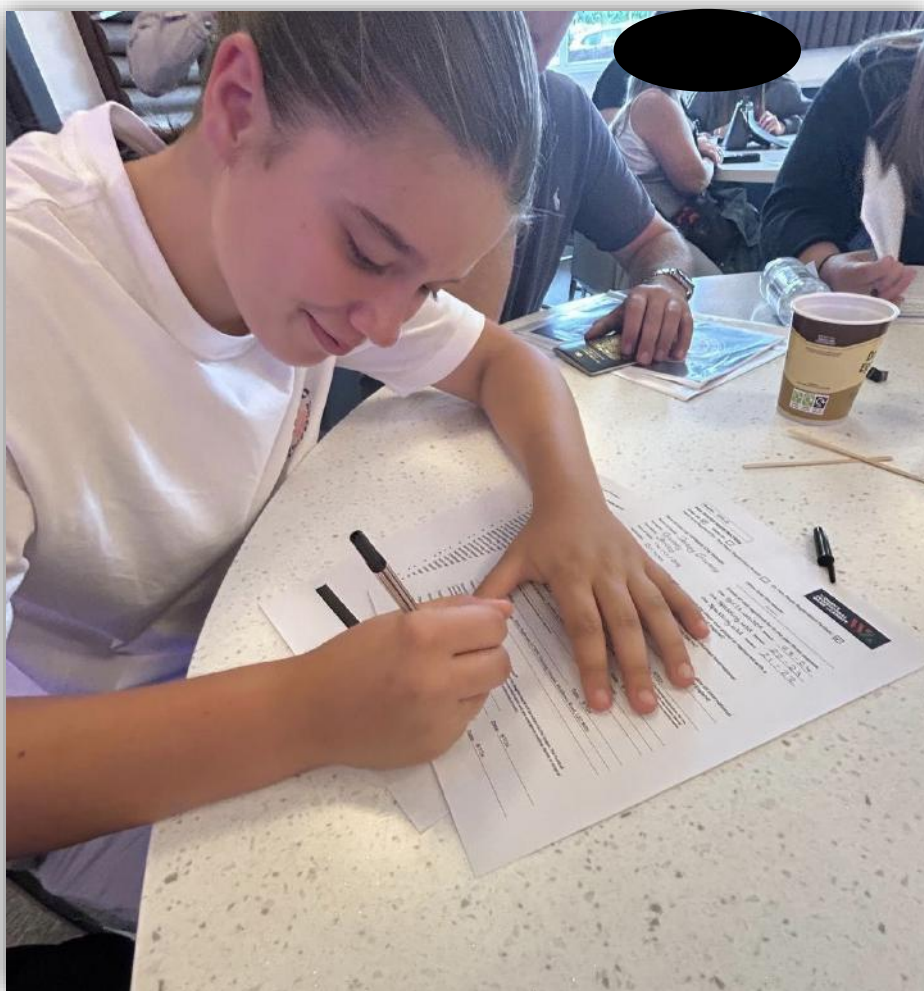


## Celebrating The Individual in Y10 - Darcy Grundy, 10J

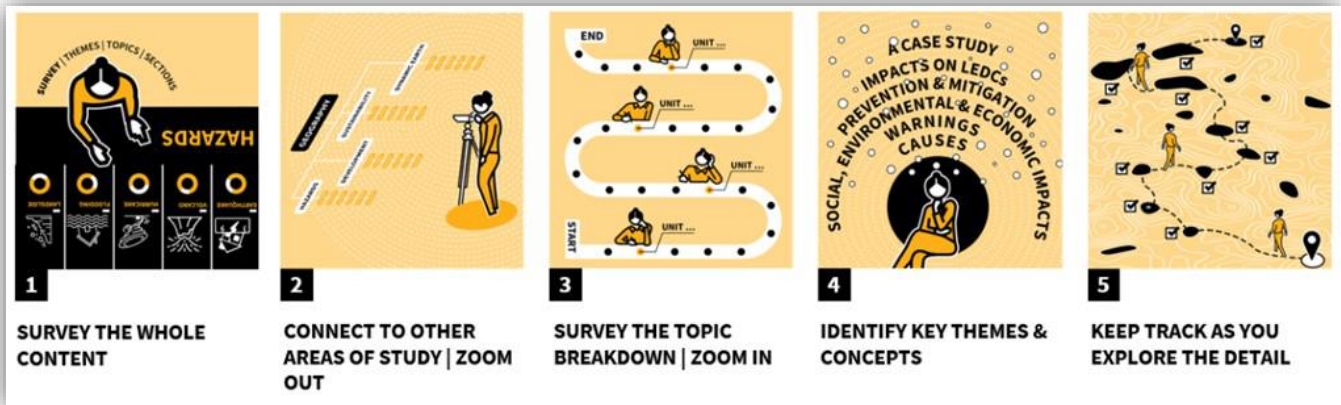
## Life in Y11

The Contingency Day is **Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> June 2025**, and there is a contingency afternoon on **Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> June 2025**.

## **Careers Update**

### **Year 11 and Year 13 Successes**

It was a busy time in August on both A Level and GCSE results days. We are extremely proud of last year's Y13 students as they leave us to move on to new ventures.

73 of our Y13 students gained a place at university to study a wide range of degree courses, including Accountancy & Finance, Architecture, Business Management, Classics, Games Design, Graphic Design, International Relations & Politics, Journalism, Medicine, Law Marine Biology, Natural Sciences, Primary Education, Psychology and many more. 86% of students who applied gained a place at their first-choice university. In addition to a wide range of study disciplines chosen, the range of 41 universities is equally impressive. Our students will be heading off in the next few weeks to universities such as York, Sheffield, Cambridge, Newcastle, Nottingham, Durham, Leeds, Lincoln, University of East Anglia, Warwick and many others.

One student has secured a Solicitor degree apprenticeship. Other students have apprenticeship positions in Business Administration, Animal Management and as a Print Technician.

Students not heading to university or taking up apprenticeships have found employment within a range of areas such as retail and horticulture, whilst others have decided to take a gap year to work or volunteer before applying to university next year.

We are equally proud of last year's Y1 students, almost all of whom are now undertaking further study, here at the High School or in other schools or sixth form colleges. We are delighted to welcome back former students and our new transferees from other schools who have enrolled into our sixth form.

Our current Y13 students will be preparing personal statements for use in university or apprenticeship/employment applications. It is a busy time between now and Christmas.

We wish all our students the best of luck for the future and hope that those who have now left will keep in touch to share their future successes.
